
NGT brings strict conditions for commerical use of ground water

- President of Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank: Jin Liqun.


IMF Grants \$4.3 bn to South Africa

2 Years ban


- Kazi Anik Islam, Bangladeshi Pacer has been handed a 2-year ban by the national Cricket board for falling dope test in 2018.
